Explore like the wind



With 60 miles (96km) of the South West Coast Path in the South Devon National Landscape and hundreds of miles of rights of way criss-crossing the area, one of the best ways of exploring is on foot.

The South Devon National Landscape website has over 35 walks you can download for free. There is a huge variety to choose from; some suitable for seasoned walkers, others for those who like an extended stroll. They range in length from 2 to 12 miles and include details of facilities and access as well as information on wildlife, archaeology and history. You can also join a guided walk - see our events section P21-34.



Geocaches in the National Landscape

20 geocaches have been placed along established walks in the National Landscape; however, prepare to go off the beaten track to hunt for the treasure!

Keep an eye on the Geocaching page on our website for five special Life on the Edge Bee geocaches that will be hidden at the end of the summer.

The Avon Estuary Walk links Bigbury-on-Sea to Bantham, via Aveton Gifford, making a 9 mile (14km) walk if you use the River Avon ferry. The ferry has restricted operating hours, so try to check the times beforehand and include the ferry crossing early in your walk, so that you aren't rushing later on (see p9).



Walking the Coast Path


Britain's longest trail. The South West Coast Path extends to 630 miles of which 60 are in the South Devon National Landscape from Berry Head in Brixham to Jennycliff in Plymouth. The path is well waymarked and a variety of guides cover the section. You can also download day walks from www.southwestcoastpath.org.uk or guides are available from local information centres. A great way of experiencing some of the most spectacular views the area has to offer.

Other trails



The Dart Valley Trail links Dartmouth to Totnes and Greenway to Kingswear, offering 17 miles (27km) of glorious walking linked handily to buses, ferries and steam trains. This means you can walk all parts of the trail

- Circle the lower Dart from Dartmouth to Dittisham and Greenway to Kingswear using the ferries (9m, 14km)
- Use the Dartmouth - Dittisham ferries and walk just one side of the route (4.5m, 7km)
- Walk from Totnes to Dittisham (8-9m, 14km) and catch the ferry to Dartmouth then a cruise boat back.



The Greenway walk links the National Trust's Greenway Estate to areas of nearby Paignton offering visitors a 'green' way to arrive! The 7 mile (11km) trail can be joined in Broadsands, Galmpton and Churston and offers the best views of Torbay's coastline and spectacular Dart Estuary in one walk.

- Stagecoach South West's 92 bus service will pull into the Park and Ride car park. Bus tickets will need to be purchased on board.

Salcombe

When there is no seasonal service from this car park it is possible to walk into town or there is the Tally Ho 164 bus service that runs daily and can be used for journeys to and from the town (limited service on Sundays and Public Holidays). Check Salcombe Town Council website for bus stop locations for this service.



Cycling

Cycling in South Devon provides access to some of the best bits of the area, but the hills can be a bit challenging! There are a number of e-bike hire centres across the National Landscape which can help with our inclines – search online if you fancy trying one out.

Routes to try

Totnes is a good base to cycle from.

Totnes to Dartington

This is a lovely route for families with young children alongside the river. It runs for two miles alongside the River Dart and by Queens Marsh and Bidwell Brook on the Dartington Hall Estate. Refreshments are available in Totnes or at The Cider Press Centre.

Totnes to Ashprington

Part of the Dart Valley Trail, this hilly route is along ancient lanes, water meadow, marshland and quiet woods. There are lovely views of the River Dart. Approximately 6 miles round trip.

Steam railways

A lovely way to appreciate the varied landscape of the area. Steam trains run along the spectacular coast from Paignton to Kingswear for Dartmouth via the passenger ferry. Call Paignton station 01803 555872 or visit www.dartmouthrailriver.co.uk for details of times and fares. Combined river excursions are also available – the Round Robin which takes you from Paignton – Totnes by bus, down the river Dart from Totnes – Dartmouth and then back on the steam train from Kingswear to Paignton.

The perfect way to see more of this special landscape



April Spring awakening

Step into Spring with the **Dartmouth Greenway round walk**. Wander

the ancient woodlands with their carpet of spring flowers.

9.5 miles, moderate to strenuous.



May Bluebell stroll

Unwind with this calm and gentle stroll from **Kingsbridge to West Alvington**. Carpets of bluebells and sweeping estuary views – a perfect way to soak up the sights and sounds of South Devon this May!

2 miles, easy.



June Celebrate the summer solstice

Make the most of the long summer days with this adventurous walk, exploring Kingston's wild and rugged coastline, featuring dramatic cliffs and expansive views out to sea.

5.5 miles, strenuous.



July Nature's abundance

Immerse yourself in this wildlife-rich landscape with this delightful walk from

Torcross to Stokenham, returning via Widdicombe. Perfect for nature lovers, it skirts around Slapton Ley Nature Reserve where the woodland, marsh and reedbed habitats provide a haven for local wildlife.

6 miles, moderate.



August Golden hour sunset stroll

See the Brixham and Kingswear peninsular soaked in golden hues and capture breathtaking views of the sun setting over the horizon.

3 miles, moderate.



September Nature's harvest

Embrace the season with this characterful walk, **Little Dartmouth and Dartmouth Castle**, with hedgerows brimming with blackberries, sloes, and elderberries. A blend of rolling countryside, historic landmarks and rocky coastline.

3.5 miles, Moderate.



October Autumn woodlands

Soak in the Autumn colours with this wonderful stroll featuring great views of Start Bay, green lanes, glorious beaches, and plenty of history and wildlife along the way! Choose between two circular walks, or tie together for a longer loop.

4.5 miles, Moderate.

Heritage



There are lots of opportunities in the National Landscape to explore the past. You can do this on your own or with the help of others like the National Trust or English Heritage.



The Kingsbridge Cookworthy Museum opened in 1972. The galleries are full of permanent displays and special exhibitions. www.kingsbridgemuseum.org.uk

Dartmouth Museum is a small, fascinating museum in an atmospheric old merchant's house on the Butterwalk.

Salcombe Maritime Museum -

A treasure trove of models, paintings, photographs and artefacts tell the story of Salcombe's links with ships and the sea from ancient times to the Second World War.

Start Point lighthouse was built in 1836 to protect shipping off Start Point in south Devon. The Lighthouse, sited at the very end of the headland, has guided vessels in passage along the English Channel for over 150 years. Details of tours at www.startpointdevon.co.uk

Lupton House is a Grade II* listed building set in beautiful parkland. The Lupton Trust was formed in 2008 to bring the House and gardens back into use for the benefit of the community. www.discoverlupton.com



Blackdown Rings was originally an Iron Age hillfort, probably built sometime after 400 BC. It was defended by a massive earth and stone rampart topped with a timber palisade, and a deep outer ditch.

The site is owned by the **Arundel Charity**, there is a small car park and paths around the monument.



The National Trust owns and manages much of the coastline in the National Landscape in addition to woods and gardens. All are open for walking. www.nationaltrust.org.uk

Life on The Edge



We are now one year into our Life on the Edge project and it is buzzing!

Over 2000 people have been involved so far, in all kinds of amazing activities ranging from guided walks, practical conservation tasks, arts activities, seed collecting, meadow making and much more! There is another exciting programme of activities already underway for Year 2, you can find out more about the events, volunteer tasks and surveys, walks and fun days in the event listings in the back of this booklet.

On the ground, the project is already making a difference over 20 hectares of species-rich grassland restored and created in some of our hotspots, and new meadows and wildflower strips planted in community sites around Torbay. We have been working with farmers and landowners to carry out surveys this summer and further enhancement works next winter. Local communities are getting involved too, with Pocket Meadow projects and Parish Pollinator plans being delivered.



Core to the Life on the Edge project is investing in people, and providing opportunities for people to learn new skills. We are very proud to be able to provide paid work and training for new people entering the world of conservation work. We currently have 1 Comms intern, 2 part time trainees and 3 Apprentices working with us. There will be more opportunities throughout the project, with another 6 apprenticeships, 4 interns and 8 trainees over the next four years. We are also running volunteer programmes across the project areas.

We could not do any of this without the support of our amazing partners at Buglife, Doorstep Arts and National Trust, volunteers, staff team and funders, including the National Lottery Heritage Fund, and more locally, Devon Environment Foundation and South West Coast Path Association –

We have programmes running with Devon Mind, Torbay Communities, Dementia-friendly Parishes around the Yealm, Kingsbridge Care Hub, Baywide PCN, Brixham Friends Centre, Torbay NHS sensory team, Activities 115 and Brixham WI.

We are planning a series of activities with Devon Young Carers, helping these young people spend time in the outdoors, learning new skills and meeting new friends. We are also delivering education sessions in schools and with the University of Exeter.

Supporting action

We have two grant schemes which can help communities and landowners carry out LotE projects where they live or work. Our Conservation grants are up to £5000 and are for carrying out projects on the ground which benefit our target species. Our Community grants are up to £2000 and are for activities and projects which engage people in LotE activities. Farming matters ...



Farming in Protected Landscapes



During the 4th year of the programme the local assessment panel has approved a further 38 projects with grant funding of just over £1 million which will be delivered by the end of March 2025.

Through the programme, farmers and land managers can be supported to carry out projects that support nature recovery, mitigate the impacts of climate change, provide opportunities for people to discover, enjoy and understand the landscape and cultural heritage, or support nature-friendly, sustainable farm businesses. It's a programme of funding for one-off projects covering these areas of work, rather than an agri-environment scheme.

The selection of projects this year has included:

- **Water Vole reintroduction to the Start catchment -**

The water vole is a priority species in the UK's Biodiversity Action Plan and is a keystone species for many wetland predators. More info: www.thehabitatgroup.uk/river-gara-water-vole-reintroduction-project



Farm champions farm walk

- **South Devon Food Hub - Pedestrian trailer and commercial kitchen to allow "farm to fork" engagement -** A Farm to Fork project, allowing schools and the public to engage in the process of creating food. <https://southdevonfoodhub.co.uk>
- **Stone walling landscape feature, and habitat creation -** Supporting Devon Rural Skills Trust through the provision of 3 stone walling sites for the trainees and volunteers to practice the heritage skill.
- **No fence collars on the coast -** Allowing grazing without fences by hardy breeds that are suited to the location

Estuaries update



South Devon National Landscape is currently involved with two saltmarsh 'restoration' projects, one a few years in along the shores of the Dart Estuary and one recently started along the Yealm Estuary shores.



The Dart Estuary

The intention of each is to carefully survey and assess the ecological health of the saltmarshes and where desirable to work with nature to conserve, enhance and/or restore them.

Saltmarshes are one of several wildlife communities that are a feature of estuaries and help support their rich and special environments that hugely benefit us all – from their incredible trapping and locking away of our carbon and nutrient excesses to their use as nurseries for many fish species. Our South Devon saltmarshes reflect the nature and form of our estuaries – typically as narrow margins at the fringe of the upper tidal shore where it is too dry for seaweeds and too salty for other land plants. We might not always recognise them but we would very much miss them if they were gone!

Many of our saltmarshes are doing just fine – spreading along the shore where and when the conditions allow and contracting as the trees along the bank naturally spread and overshadow them. However, some have suffered the effects of a past history of disturbance and ignorant misuse (before we realised just how important they are), such as excessive boat wake and storage or launching.

Within the Dart Estuary, the Dart Saltmarsh Project partners are trialling the use and placement of woodland brash bundles, bound by sisal rope and staked into the mud around and within saltmarsh gullies. This helps slow the flow of water and encourages the build up of sediment behind to a tidal height to support new saltmarsh. And a visit to Longmarsh, Totnes will reward you to a brand new boardwalk around the saltmarsh there, together with a new interpretation panel.

Within the Yealm Estuary, we have carried out health-check type surveys of the estuary's saltmarshes to assess their condition and potential for enhancement. We will be following these up with a detailed botanical survey of the special salt tolerant plants that are the real builders of the saltmarsh communities.

Access for all

We were thrilled to have additional funds last year to allocate to access projects thanks to Defra. With this investment we hope that wheelchair users and others will be able to enjoy more of what the area has to offer.

These included

- Provision of accessible picnic benches to 11 parishes.
- Purchase of a Tramper for use by the National Trust at Collaton Fishacre near Kingswear
- Financing a boardwalk at Blackpool Sands near Dartmouth enabling wheelchair users to get up close and personal with the shore.
- Path improvements at Berry Head
